**Full Paper:** Each article should be accompanied by an abstract and should be between 3,500 and 6,000 words (14 printed pages), including title, author(s) information, full name(s), institution, address, phone and e-mail address of the corresponding author, tables, figures and references in APA format.

**Text:** Should be type –written on one side of A4 size papers with 2.54cm margins all around and should be in 1.5 line spacing
